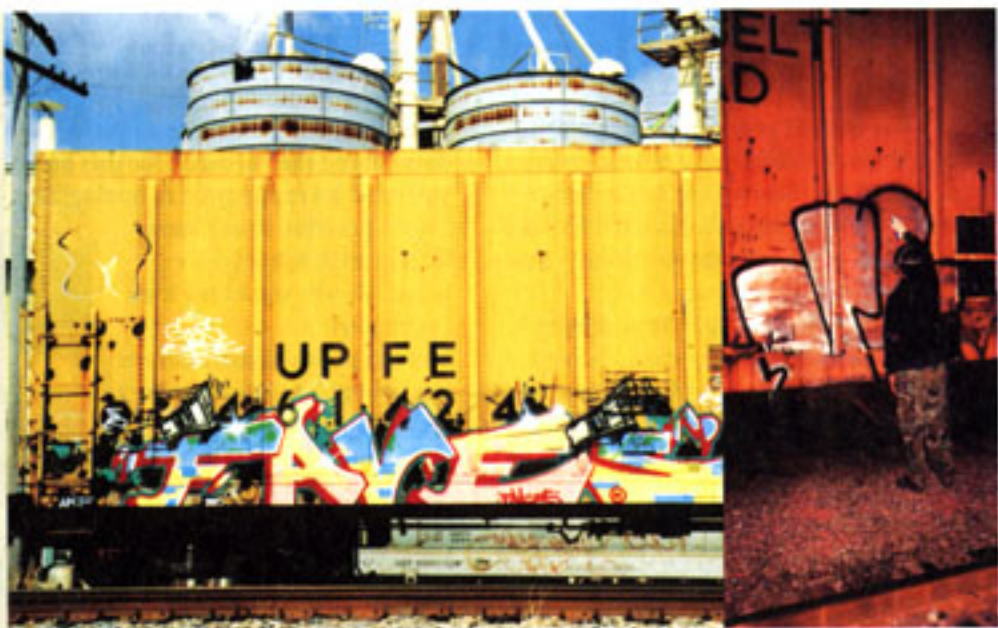

Public nuisance or art? Harry N. Abrams, a respected art-book publisher, next month is releasing "Freight Train Graffiti," a book that explores the history of the freight-train graffiti movement, from hobos' "monikers" during the Great Depression (an early precursor) to the corporate advertising and thriving art scene of today. "It's a culture that has never been fully documented," says Roger Gastman, coauthor of the book, who's painted some 300 trains himself.
